

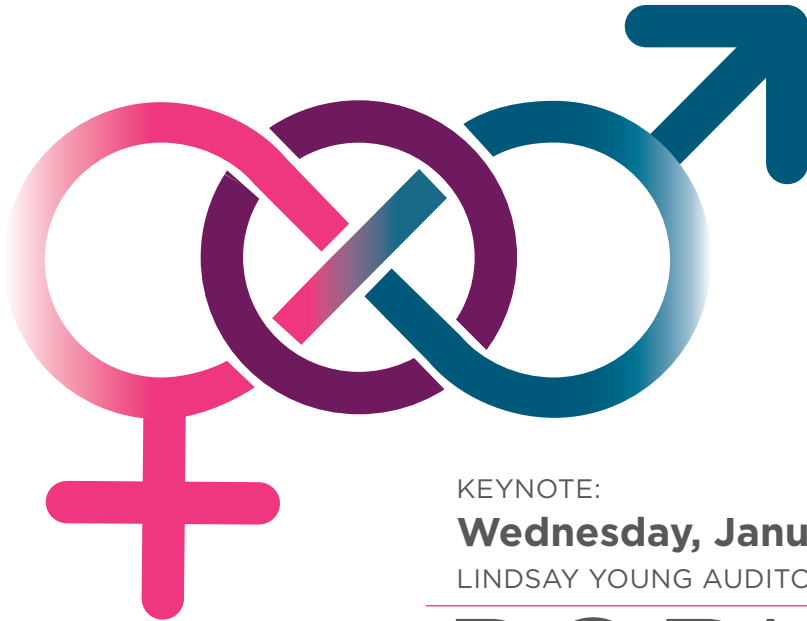

PORN WORK *Behind the Scenes*



In her keynote address, **HEATHER BERG**, lecturer of gender studies at the University of Southern California, will explore the pornography production process and discuss the conditions of porn labor. Through her ethnographic fieldwork and interviews with workers, managers, and crew, she asks how workers experience their jobs, and how these experiences are shaped by identity, policy, and the changing relations of labor under late capitalism. Berg will also discuss the complexities of doing engaged feminist research.
